Pam Burpee made "doughnut pancakes" for the kids and the weather cooperated nicely, for a change. The feeling of spring is in the air at last.

The Woodstock Farm and Craft Market will be closed on Good Friday, April 3, with the Market Day moving to Thursday. Hours on Thursday will be 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.. The Market Café will be open Thursday, but Val Flewelling's outside barbecue will not be in operation. The Market will be open again on Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Val's barbecue be back on April 3.

With the warm sunny days and below freezing nights of this past week, maple syrup production in the Saint John Valley region should be off to a good start. If this weather pattern holds, we should have a good season. New Brunswick ranks in the top group of maple syrup producing regions. Quebec is by far the largest producer, virtually in a category by itself with production close to eight million gallons. Vermont is next with almost one million gallons. Then New Brunswick, Maine, New York, and Ontario are all in the 300,000- to 400,000-gallon range.

A number of local producers have open house events at their sugar-houses during the season, which are nice outings for the whole family. Watch for their notices in the Bugle-Observer.

The Woodstock Farm Market Co-operative held its annual general meeting on Sunday, March 22. For the last number of years the meeting has been held at Sobeys Community Room, but now, with the recent renovations, the Market building on King Street can accommodate this annual event.
